**What does 'multi-age' classrooms mean?**

## Comparison of Learning Structures

Split Grades	Blended Grades	Multi-Aged Grades	Looping Grades
<b>Characteristics:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children from two grades sharing one learning space, led by a single teacher – include a span of ages greater than one year.</li> <li>Curriculum is taught completely separately.</li> <li>While one group is being taught, the other grade is working independently without readily available access to the teacher.</li> <li>Limited opportunities for re-grouping or personalization of learning for students.</li> </ul>	<b>Characteristics:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students from two grades share one learning space, led by a single teacher – include a span of ages greater than one year.</li> <li>There is one “curriculum” taught, blending the KSA’s (Knowledge-skills-attributes) that both grades have in common and meshing common content; all the curriculum goals are covered.</li> <li>Enhanced opportunities for cooperative learning, pro-social interaction, flexible instructional groupings according to developmental needs.</li> <li>Usually for one school year.</li> </ul>	<b>Characteristics:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students from two grades share one learning space, led by a single teacher – include a span of ages greater than one year.</li> <li>There is essentially one curriculum taught, blending the KSAs from both grade levels and meshing common content.</li> <li>Children experience multiple years of instruction with a teacher; additional teachers or teacher assistants may be included in that learning space.</li> <li>For content areas such as science or social studies, there may be “flips” made.</li> <li>Excellent leadership, social, flexible academic grouping opportunities.</li> </ul>	<b>Characteristics:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students from one grade level are assigned to a teaching space led by a single teacher.</li> <li>A regular year of curricular instruction is followed.</li> <li>The students “loop” up to the next grade with the same teacher and group of peers, spending two grade levels with one teacher and the same classmates.</li> </ul>
